## ASX Note – Drafting and Execution Instructions

Declarations must be made by a natural person. For declarations regarding corporations, the declaration must be by a natural person who knows the facts (usually an officer of the corporation) making the declaration in his/her own right.

Declarants should take their own legal advice on the formal requirements for making statutory declarations under the *Statutory Declarations Act 1959*. The standardised list above sets out the list of acceptable witnesses under the *Statutory Declarations Act 1959*. As general information only, ASX notes that this includes (for persons making this statutory declaration in any jurisdiction outside of Australia) a notary public exercising functions outside of Australia and an Australian Consular Officer.

All italicised text, square and curly brackets and end notes should be deleted from the final statutory declaration before it is executed.
