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1. Introduction

This Guidance Note is published to assist listed entities and their advisers to understand the ASX Online facility and to comply with their obligation under Listing Rule 15.3 to give documents to ASX electronically using that facility, which has been established by ASX Limited (ASX) to allow ASX listed entities, the issuers of other ASX quoted products and authorised professional advisers (such as accountants and lawyers) to give documents to ASX electronically rather than in paper form.¹

A listed entity is required as a condition of admission to the official list to agree with ASX in writing that documents may be given to ASX and authenticated electronically, and to establish the facilities required for it to do this.² The form ASX currently requires to evidence that agreement is the form of *Application and agreement for use of electronic lodgement facility and entity details facility* (ASX Online Agreement) set out in Annexure A.

A document for release to the market that is given to ASX by or on behalf of a listed entity must be given electronically unless it falls within an excluded category published by ASX from time to time.³ The only documents currently in an excluded category are proxy voting notifications under section 251AA of the Corporations Act.⁴

For these purposes, a document is taken to be given to ASX electronically if each of the following requirements is met:⁵

- ASX and the person giving the document to ASX have agreed, in writing,⁶ that documents of that kind may be given to ASX and authenticated electronically;
- ASX receives the document electronically; and
- the entity meets the requirements set and published by ASX for giving a document to ASX electronically.⁷

Under the ASX Online Agreement, if ASX receives an electronic document⁸ and the electronic document has been authenticated in accordance with ASX's published authentication procedures,⁹ the electronic document is taken to be as valid, effective and enforceable as if it had been written on paper, signed and authorised by the listed entity.

2. The process for a listed entity to give a document to ASX electronically

There are essentially two ways in which a listed entity may give a document to ASX electronically:

- for notifications of certain prescribed corporate actions – namely, dividends or other distributions, interest payments, changes in interest rates, consolidations, splits or cash returns of capital – by completing an online form provided within ASX Online, which when completed will automatically generate a PDF announcement in a standard format for release to the market via ASX's Market Announcements Platform (MAP);¹⁰ or
- in all other cases, by uploading the document as a PDF document using the electronic lodgement facility within ASX Online, with that document then being released to the market via MAP.¹¹

The online forms for prescribed corporate actions contain validation rules designed to ensure that all the key information the market requires in relation to the corporate action is included and that the corporate action

ASX will nonetheless accept an electronic lodgement of a proxy voting notification under section 251AA of the Corporations Act via ASX Online and disseminate it to the market via MAP. It will also accept other forms of lodgement of such notifications that are permitted under the Corporations Act (see note [211015](#) below).

complies with the applicable timetable set out in the Listing Rules. They also trigger system-generated warnings if the corporate action might create issues with a concurrent corporate action.¹²

Unless ASX agrees otherwise, where ASX has made available an online form for a corporate action, a document for release to the market in relation to that corporate action must be generated by completing the relevant online form and lodging it through ASX Online.¹³

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2.3. What is ASX Online?

ASX Online is a secure extranet site provided by ASX to facilitate the electronic lodgement of announcements with ASX and their quick and efficient dissemination to the market via ASX's Market Announcements Platform (MAP).¹⁴

The online forms for prescribed corporate actions are accessed via the "Create Online Forms" page in ASX Online. This page allows an authorised user to start preparing a draft notification of a corporate action and to save it for further editing. Once saved, the form can be accessed via the "Manage Online Forms" page in ASX Online, where authorised users can edit the saved form, submit it for lodgement to ASX when completed, track the progress of lodged forms as they are processed by the ASX Markets Announcements office, and also access previously lodged forms for a corporate action to notify the market about an update to, or cancellation of, that corporate action.

ASX Online includes an "eLodgement Centre" electronic lodgement facility for lodging PDF announcements is accessed by the "E-lodge PDF Announcement" page in ASX Online, where authorised users can give announcements and related documents to ASX electronically for release to the market. Once a PDF announcement has been lodged using that facility, authorised users can track the progress of the announcement as it is processed by the ASX Markets Announcements office via the "status" page in ASX Online where authorised users can check where an announcement is up to in its processing by the ASX Market Announcements office.

ASX Online also includes an "Entity Company Details Facility" screen, which enables a listed entity to notify ASX of changes in its details (such as its registered address, address for correspondence with ASX, internet address, head office telephone, head office fax, principal activities, directors, senior management and registry details) via web forms. Changes to these details are updated directly to ASX's database and, where relevant, are uploaded overnight to the listed entity information pages on www.asx.com.au.

ASX Online also has a "User Details" screen that allows nominated "administrators" to add new users, change the contact details of or delete existing users, set the access level of users, and set or re-set user passwords. It also allows users to be added to users to be selected an email list to receive emails notifications from ASX acknowledging the release of an announcement to the market or that the entity has been "tagged" in an announcement by another entity and/or a separate email list to receive reminders about the due date for lodgement of periodic reports.

Listed entities may use the "External Notifications" page of ASX Online to enter up to 30 email addresses external to the listed entity that will also receive notifications from ASX acknowledging the release of an announcement to the market or that the entity has been "tagged" in an announcement by another entity.

In addition, ASX Online allows users to access electronic copies of the Listing Rules, Listed Entities Updates, the ASX reporting calendar and other useful information.

3.4. ASIC Class Order relief

ASIC has granted class order relief to facilitate the operation of ASX Online.¹⁵

Under Class Order CO 00/2449 *ASX Electronic Lodgment Facility – relief from paper form lodgement*, the Corporations Act has been modified to allow ASX listed entities and their wholly owned subsidiaries to lodge most of the documents the Act requires them to lodge with ASX¹⁶ electronically rather than in paper form.

Under Class Order CO 00/2451 *Electronic lodgment of certain reports with the ASX – approval*, the Corporations Act has been modified to allow ASX listed entities and their wholly owned subsidiaries to lodge with ASX (as agent for ASIC) electronic versions of the financial reports and directors' reports they would otherwise be required to lodge with ASIC in paper form under sections 319(1), 320 and 322(1) of the Act.¹⁷

Under Class Order CO 01/1519 *Disclosure of directors' interests*, ASIC has granted relief to the directors of public companies listed on ASX from complying with the obligation to notify ASX of certain notifiable interests on condition that all of the information which would have been required to be disclosed by a director under that section is provided to ASX by the relevant company electronically in a notice that complies with ASX Listing Rule 3.19A.

4.5. User requirements

To use ASX Online, a listed entity will need to have a computer with internet access, [internet browser software compatible with ASX Online](#) and software (such as Adobe Acrobat) to convert documents to PDF. ASX does not provide these facilities.

It is the responsibility of the listed entity to ensure that it has suitable hardware and software and a reliable internet service provider so that it is able to use ASX Online.

5.6. Security requirements

ASX Online requires users to have a username and password to enter the system.

Each individual granted access to ASX Online by an administrator must have a separate unique username and password. Passwords must:

- be from eight to 12 characters in length;
- contain at least one upper case letter;
- contain at least one lower case letter;
- contain at least one number character; and
- contain at least one non-alphanumeric character (e.g. !#\$%^&*-+=,.":;).

Passwords expire every 45 days and must be re-set. A user can re-set their own password without needing to involve their administrator. When they do, they will be sent an email by ASX to their nominated email address confirming their new password.

A new user is also required to re-set their password at first log-in.

ASX Online is case sensitive, and so users need to make sure that capital and lower case letters are correctly used when entering their username and password.

ASX Online allows for user-types with the following privileges:

- Administrator – can create new users, change the contact details of or delete existing users, re-set user names and set and reset passwords for other ASX Online users within the listed entity;
- Elodgement user – can create, edit and lodge online forms and lodge PDF documents via the electronic lodgement facility;
- Update company details user – can update the pages in the "Entity Details" menu.
- Read only user – can access ASX Online for read only purposes (these users cannot access the New Online Forms, Manage Online Forms or E-lodge PDF Announcement pages in ASX Online).

Listed entities should note that Elodgement users may lodge announcements to the market on behalf of the listed entity and accordingly take care in assigning that user-type within the listed entity.

A user who forgets their username and/or password can have it re-set by their administrator.

6.7. User contact details

Where a user eLodges electronically lodges a document using ASX Online (whether via an online form or as a PDF announcement), their name, telephone number and email address are automatically captured as part of the lodgement, based on their username and password and their personal details recorded in the ASX Online user details screen. If ASX has a query or concern about an electronic lodgement, eLodgement, it will contact the user who lodged it using that telephone number or email address.

ASX asks that administrators are diligent in keeping these fields up-to-date at all times, particularly the telephone number, so that if ASX does have an issue with an announcement, it can contact the relevant user promptly. In this regard, it is generally better for users to supply mobile rather than office phone numbers, to facilitate contact outside of office hours.

7.8. File requirements

Where an online form is used to notify ASX of a prescribed corporate action, there are no applicable file requirements – the listed entity need only complete the online form and submit it through ASX Online.

All other documents lodged using the eLodgement electronic lodgement facility must be in PDF¹⁸ format. Any security settings on the PDF document must be removed prior to lodgement. If they are not, an error message will be displayed on-screen to the user requesting the security settings to be removed. The following requirements must also be satisfied:

- All pages in the PDF file an eLodgement electronic lodgement must be A4 in size and in 200 DPI or 300 DPI (dots per inch) for clarity.

- The maximum file size for an elodgement electronic lodgement is 20 MB. If a document being lodged is larger than 20 MB, it must be split into separate files, each of which is less than 20 MB.
- To keep file sizes as small as possible, users should convert non-PDF documents to PDF documents using appropriate conversion software, rather than scanning them as PDF images. Photographs, graphs and other images should not be in resolutions greater than 300 DPI.

8.9. Guidelines for title headers

ASX Online automatically assigns a title or header for an announcement about a prescribed corporate action made via an online form, as follows:

where:

(1) = New, Update or Cancel, whichever applies.

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(2) = the ASX security code to which the form relates (as provided in Part 1 of the online form).

(3) = the ASX issuer code used in respect of security consolidations/splits (this is used in preference to the ASX security code as there may be multiple securities to which the announcement relates).

For example, an announcement updating an interest payment notification for the listed entity XYZ Limited (ASX Issuer Code XYZ) in respect of its floating rate unsecured bonds maturing 31 December 2020 (security code XYZHA) would read: "Update – Appx 3A.2 Notification of Interest Payment – XYZHA". The header for the first announcement of a consolidation or split for that entity would read: "New – Appx 3A.3 Notification of Consolidation/Split – XYZ".

For all other announcements, the user must supply a title or header for an announcement.

The elodgement centre "E-lodge PDF Announcement" page of ASX Online includes a "title header" field where a title for an announcement can be inserted.¹⁹ ASX will generally use the title header supplied in that field as the name for the announcement on the ASX website and in the message about the announcement that gets published on its trading platform and displayed on broker trading terminals.

ASX asks that persons lodging announcements for release to the market use title headers for those announcements that briefly and accurately convey the contents of the announcement (eg "1:4 rights issue of ordinary shares at \$1" or "Full year profits up by 20%").

ASX has in the past experienced difficulties with announcements that have been given fairly innocuous titles (such as "Chairman's Address to AGM") but have had market sensitive material embedded in them. ASX would therefore ask listed entities to ensure that the title header to such an announcement clearly identifies the fact that it contains market sensitive information (eg "Chairman's Address to AGM and Buyback Announcement") or, better still, that market sensitive announcements are made on a stand-alone basis and not incorporated in other announcements that may not be market sensitive.

9.10. Confirmation of transmission

Where an user is-successfully lodges~~s~~ a document using ASX Online (whether via an online form or as a PDF announcement), an on-screen message will appear confirming that the transmission has been successful²⁰ and the Status of Announcements page (and, if the lodgement was via an online form, the Manage Online Forms page²¹)s entity's status page on ASX Online will be updated with a document id and to show that the announcement has been "Delivered".

As the announcement is processed by the ASX Market Announcements office, its status will be updated to "Accepted", "In Progress" and then finally "Released".

Once an announcement has been released by the ASX Market Announcements office to the market, ASX will send an e-mail to the entity confirming that fact.²² The email will attach a copy of the released announcement, provided it has a file size of no more than 5 MB.

If the announcement is tagged by the ASX Market Announcements office as relating to or affecting another listed entity (for example, where the lodging entity is announcing a takeover offer for the other entity or lodging a substantial holding notice relating to the other entity), ASX will also send the other entity an email advising of the release of the announcement. Again, the email will attach a copy of the released announcement, provided it has a file size of no more than 5 MB.

Where the lodgement of an announcementonline form or PDF document on ASX Online fails, an on-screen message will appear in red showing any identifiable cause for the failure, such as "Incorrect password" or "Document must be in PDF format". If the cause for the failure is not identifiable, the message will simply advise that the transmission has failed and request the user to immediately contact the ASX Market Announcements office.

10.11. Back-up fax lodgement facilities

ASX has a facility for lodgement of documents by fax. This is primarily for use by persons other than listed entities who do not have access to ASX Online and who need to give a document to ASX under the Corporations Act.

As far as listed entities are concerned, the fax lodgement facility is strictly for use as an emergency back-up facility if ASX Online is unavailable or if a listed entity is having technical difficulties accessing it²³ (although, as explained previously,²⁴ for technical reasons the fax lodgement facility can also be used by listed entities for the lodgement of proxy voting notifications under section 251AA of the Corporations Act).

In the case of online forms, if technical difficulties are experienced using ASX's online forms, listed entities may complete a word version of the relevant Listing Rule Appendix, convert the document to PDF format and lodge the document as a PDF announcement. This may only be done where ASX has advised the listed entity that ASX's online forms are not working or that it may use that process due to its own technical difficulties. If ASX Online is unavailable for electronic lodgement, the word version of the relevant Listing Rule Appendix may be sent by fax to ASX, using the back-up facility mentioned above.

11.12. Technical difficulties

Annexure A: Application and agreement for use of electronic lodgement facility and entity details facility

Part 1 – Application to use electronic lodgement facility and entity details facility

Name of entity

We (the entity) apply to use the electronic lodgement facility and entity details facility and agree to comply with the terms of this agreement.

Part 2 – Agreement

ASX policy requirements

1. The ASX policy requirements as in force from time to time form part of this agreement and we agree to comply with them.
2. We acknowledge that ASX may vary the ASX policy requirements at any time by publishing notice of the variation on the ASX web site.

Licence to ASX

3. We grant ASX a licence to use, copy, redistribute, transmit and publish any information given by us to ASX using the entity details facility.

Validity and reliance

4. If ASX receives an electronic document in accordance with the ASX policy requirements and the electronic document has been eLodged using the authentication procedures, each of the following apply.
 - (a) The electronic document is as valid, effective and enforceable as if it had been written on paper and signed by us.
 - (b) The electronic document is taken to be authorised and sent by us.
 - (c) The electronic document is taken to be an identical copy of the document that we sent.
 - (d) ASX is entitled to act and rely on the electronic document.
 - (e) If the electronic document contains any representations or warranties, we (the entity) make those representations or warranties.
 - (f) The electronic document complies with the requirements of the listing rules and the Corporations Act.
5. Clause 4 does not apply in the case of a particular document if each of the following apply.
 - (a) Before the electronic document is received by ASX, we give ASX a notice stating that the electronic document is not authorised by us.
 - (b) ASX has a reasonable time to act on that notice before it receives the electronic document.
6. We warrant that where the authentication procedures have been used to enter information using the entity details facility that the information is true and accurate. We acknowledge each of the following.
 - (a) ASX is entitled to act and rely on that information.
 - (b) Entry of the information is not compliance with an obligation to give that information to ASX under the listing rules.

7. We warrant that where the authentication procedures have been used to enter information using the entity details facility or eLodge documents that the information is not defamatory of any person and release of the information to the market would not be a contempt of court.

Limitation of liability

8. Except to the extent that a warranty is implied by law or liability by law cannot be excluded, each of the following apply.

- (a) ASX does not warrant that the electronic lodgement facility or entity details facility provided will be available or will function or perform as expected or required.
- (b) ASX is not liable to us or any other person for any loss, damage, costs or expenses of any kind arising out of or in connection with any delay, omission, default or error by ASX in relation to the availability, functionality or performance of the ASX web site, the electronic transmission, receipt or any other dealing with an eLodged document, or any dealing with the information entered using the entity details facility, except where such loss, damage, costs or expenses are due to a wilful, unlawful or negligent act or omission on the part of ASX.
- (c) ASX is not liable to us or any other person for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, or loss of data or profits, whether or not ASX was aware of the possibility of such loss or damage.

9. We shall at all times indemnify and hold harmless, ASX, its subsidiary companies and their officers, employees and agents from and against any loss (including reasonable legal costs and expenses) or liability incurred or suffered by any of them arising from any proceedings against them where such loss or liability was caused by any of the following.

- (a) A breach by us of our obligations (including warranties) under this agreement.
- (b) Any wilful, unlawful or negligent act or omission by us.

Termination of this agreement

10. ASX may terminate this agreement in any of the following cases.

- (a) At any time, by giving us not less than 14 days written notice.
- (b) Immediately, if we are in breach of any term of this agreement.
- (c) Immediately, if ASIC terminates our ability to lodge documents electronically with ASX as agent for ASIC.

11. We may terminate this agreement at any time by giving ASX not less than 14 days' notice.

Governing law

12. This agreement is governed by the law of New South Wales.

Definitions

13. Expressions that are not defined in this agreement, but have a particular meaning in the listing rules have the same meaning in this agreement.

Part 1 – Documents that may be given to ASX electronically

- 1.1 Documents required to be given to ASX by a listed entity for release to the market under the ASX Listing Rules or the Corporations Act must be eLodged, *with the exception of the following*.
 - Record of proxy votes under section 251AA of the Corporations Act.
A record of proxy votes under section 251AA of the Corporations Act may be eLodged but it is not mandatory for this to occur.
- 1.2 Documents required to be given to ASX by someone other than a listed entity under the Corporations Act for release to the market may be eLodged.
- 1.3 Documents required to be given to ASX by a Warrant-Issuer or AQUA Product Issuer for release to the market under the ASX Operating Rules may be eLodged.
- 1.4 No other documents may be eLodged.

Part 2 – Access to the electronic lodgement facility and entity details facility

- 2.1 We must obtain and operate our own internet access, computer, hardware, software and all other equipment required to access the electronic lodgement facility and entity details facility.
- 2.2 We must obtain and pay for our own reliable internet access and communications links to ASX.
- 2.3 We must use software that converts documents into pdf such as Adobe Acrobat.
- 2.4 We must convert a document to pdf before transmitting it to ASX.

Part 2A – Online forms

- 2A.1 Where ASX makes available an online form relating to a matter, we must generate a document for release to the market by completing the relevant online form made available by ASX and lodging it through the part of the electronic lodgement facility provided for the lodgement of online forms.
- 2A.2 We must provide the information in the online form within the timeframes specified in the online form.
- 2A.3 Where we have lodged an online form in respect of a matter, we must make any change to the information in the online form by lodging an online form which is an update to or cancellation of the original online form.
- 2A.4 Where we have lodged an online form which contains information inconsistent with information we have provided in a PDF announcement, we acknowledge that ASX will treat the information in the online form as being accurate unless we advise ASX otherwise and undertake to immediately lodge an update to the online form which corrects the inconsistency.

Part 3 – Authentication procedures

- 3.1 In order to access the electronic lodgement facility and entity details facility each user must enter a unique username and password.
- 3.2 We will ensure our users do not disclose their username or password to any person not authorised by us to use them.
- 3.3 We must give ASX details of all persons authorised to use ASX Online on our behalf.
